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Commander Philip Way called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Chaplain Lloyd Sprinkle gave the invocation. The Camp gave the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag. Salutes were given to the Virginia and Confederate flags.

Robert Weatherholtz moved to accept the October adjutant's report as printed in the November newsletter. Motion was seconded and passed.
